## Positive Playtimes and lunchtimes

We are working hard to improve the behaviour at playtimes and lunchtimes. After half term we will be introducing 'Playground Pals'. Our pals will set up activities and support play during playtime and lunchtimes. This will be coordinated by Mrs Howells and Mrs Brake with the assistance of the Year 4 children. In addition to this, Mr Gibbs will be providing multi-skills activities on a Tuesday and Thursday to support gross motor skills.

Football will continue but we have set up rules for the children to follow. If children do not follow the rules, it will result in them being asked not to play. Mrs Jordan-Gill will be out there as often as she can to referee the games. Football will only be on the astro turf and not on the main playground. The rules are as follows:

#### Football Charter:

- 1. Always play fairly
- 2. Listen to the referee (a referee must be chosen each day)
- 3. Stick to the rules of the game
- 4. Tackling is only allowed if the other player has the ball
- 5. Sliding tackles and unnecessary physical behaviour is not allowed (this includes pushing, barging and shirt pulling)
- 6. Always apologise if you make a mistake
- 7. Always use kind words
- 8. Everyone is allowed to play
- 9. Be a good sportsperson.

We have plenty of footballs in school and kindly ask that children do not bring their own footballs into school.
