## Reading

### Year Three

Recognise some familiar words in written form

- understand words displayed in the classroom
- identify and read simple words
- read and understand simple messages.

Make links between some phonemes, rhymes and spellings, and read aloud familiar words

- pronounce accurately the most commonly used characters, letters and letter strings
- read aloud a familiar sentence, rhyme or poem.

### Year Four

Read and understand a range of familiar written phrases

- match phrases and short sentences to pictures or themes
- identify non-fiction texts by their style and layout, eg a recipe, a weather forecast, instructions for making or doing something, a letter, an advertisement.

Follow a short familiar text, listening and reading at the same time

- make links between spoken and written words
- identify common spelling patterns in letter strings.

Read some familiar words and phrases aloud and pronounce them accurately

- read aloud words which they use on a regular basis, e.g. numbers, days, weather
- pronounce letter strings, words and phrases accurately with good pronunciation.

Listen and respond to simple rhymes, stories and songs <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• identify rhyming words</li><li>• perform finger rhymes and sing songs</li><li>• join in with storytelling.</li></ul> Recognise and respond to sound patterns and words <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• listen with care</li><li>• identify phonemes which are the same as or different from English and other known languages</li></ul> Listen attentively and understand instructions, everyday classroom language and praise words <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• repeat words and phrases modelled by the teacher</li><li>• remember a sequence of spoken words</li><li>• use physical response, mime and gesture to convey meaning and show understanding.</li></ul>	Listen for specific words and phrases <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• listen with care</li><li>• use physical response to show recognition and understanding of specific words and phrases.</li></ul> Listen for sounds, rhyme and rhythm <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• identify specific sounds e.g. rhymes, letters, phonemes, words</li><li>• compare different sounds.</li></ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Identify specific sounds, phonemes and words.</li><li>Recognise commonly used rhyming sounds.</li><li>Imitate pronunciation of sounds.</li><li>Hear main word classes.</li><li>Recognise question forms and negatives.</li><li>Recognise how sounds are represented in written form.</li><li>Notice the spelling of familiar words.</li><li>Recognise that languages describe familiar things differently.</li><li>Recognise that many languages are spoken in the UK and across the world.</li><li>Recognise conventions of politeness.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Reinforce and extend recognition of word classes and understand their function.</li><li>Recognise and apply simple agreements, singular and plural.</li><li>Use question forms.</li><li>Recognise that texts in different languages will often have the same conventions of style and layout.</li><li>Apply phonic knowledge of the language to support reading and writing.</li></ul>
