

Finding a part or the whole.






How can I help my child with maths at home?

Talking about when and why you are doing maths will help your child to understand why we need to learn different maths strategies and when to use them.


There are lots of opportunities to see and use maths in a real life context:

- Whilst shopping (money, quantities, weight)
- Baking and cooking at home, weighing, measuring, time, fractions..
- Whilst out walking look for shapes and numbers around you.
- Planning events (days of the week, months of the year, money).
- Playing board games (counting).
- Shops (paying for items, working out how much change you should get).
