Tax-Free Childcare

What is it? Tax-Free Childcare is a government scheme that helps working parents with the cost of childcare.

How does it work?

- For every £8 you pay into your childcare account, the government adds £2.
- You can receive up to £2,000 per child per year (£4,000 for disabled children).

Eligibility:

- Both parents must be working (or the single parent in a single-parent household).
- Each parent must earn at least £152 per week but less than £100,000 per year.



- Your child must be under 12 (or under 17 if disabled).

How to apply:

1. Create an online childcare account at [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk).
2. Pay money into your account.
3. Use the account to pay your registered childcare provider.

Benefits:

- Helps reduce childcare costs.
- Flexible use for various types of childcare (nurseries, childminders, after-school clubs, etc.).

Important Notes:

- You cannot use Tax-Free Childcare at the same time as childcare vouchers or Universal Credit.
- Ensure your childcare provider is registered with the scheme.
