Dear Parents and Carers,

A warm welcome back to school after the half term holiday. I hope, despite the current news of what is happening in Ukraine, that you all managed to have a restful break and enjoyed the good weather at the end of the week - something of a contrast to the end of half term and the effects of Storm Eunice! I am happy to report that the school remained undamaged despite the high winds, and we hope all our families were left relatively unscathed too.

HeartSmart Focus: Don't hold on to what's wrong

This half term our HeartSmart focus is 'Don't hold on to what's wrong'. We will be looking at the importance of forgiveness and learning how to cope with negative emotions. We will also be looking at how our behaviour affects others and we will be linking this to our work on bullying.

Book week this week

Don't forget we have lots of activities taking place this week to celebrate World Book Week. Everyone is invited back into school in their pyjamas on Wednesday evening from 5.30pm to 6.15pm to listen to stories read by staff and enjoy a hot chocolate - we do ask that parents not leave children at school, but instead join us in the hall for a warm drink and a chat.

On Thursday we are asking children to think how they can 'Express Yourself' - dress as a word that means something to you!

COVID 19 Update

As you are no doubt aware, government guidance on Covid-19 changed during half term. The requirement for regular asymptomatic testing has been lifted for staff and students in most settings, and there is no longer a legal duty to self-isolate in the case of a positive test.











Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. Fully vaccinated close contacts will no longer need to test daily for 7 days, and the legal requirement for close contacts who are not fully vaccinated to self-isolate has been removed.

Public Health Advice reads as follows: Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to their educational setting if they normally attend one, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature.

Routine contact tracing will end.

Free testing will end from 1st April for the general public, including those with symptoms. The government will continue to provide free tests for symptomatic people in older age groups, and those who are most vulnerable.

It is a priority for Broadmayne to ensure children attend school on a regular basis - therefore, your child should attend school unless they are not well enough to come in, or they test positive for Covid-19, as described above. The school continues to seek to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with Covid-19 and so would strongly encourage those who test positive to follow the above guidance until such times as that guidance changes.

Rescue Visit and Talk - via Helicopter!

We are very excited to let you know that next Monday, the 7th March, the school will be visited by Peter Faulding, the Founder and CEO of <u>Specialist Group International - 24/7 Specialist Rescue Response</u>. The group supports rescues of all types, both privately and on behalf of police and fire services across the country. Peter was involved in a rescue attempt of a young child where, very sadly, the child drowned. He has now decided to run a campaign to raise awareness of water safety amongst children.

He has purchased 1000 life jackets in memory of the child and is distributing them to primary schools. He and a colleague (whose daughters attended our school a few years ago) are presenting us with 8 life jackets and will give the children a water safety brief. Of course we are really grateful for this, but more excitingly Peter will be arriving on the school field in a helicopter! Children will have the opportunity to have a look around this as part of the visit - we can't wait!

Dorchester Science Festival
