Dear Parents and Carers,

As we reach the end of the autumn term, this will be my last newsletter before the holidays begin. I am sure you are all aware that, similar to other schools in the area, we have had a high number of children absent over the past couple of weeks, mainly driven by a rise in COVID infections. I think this has come as something of a shock to the school, as we have managed to avoid a high infection rate until now. We have worked with Public Health to guide our response, and will continue to do so until the end of term and into the holidays. Please do all remain vigilant - we are seeing several infections that have begun with a headache or cold symptoms, so it is worth keeping an eye out for these.

<u>Nativity</u>

The nativity was filmed last week, and is due to be ready to send out at the beginning of next week - just in time for the holidays. Once ready we will send the private Youtube link out to all our families.
