Dear Parents and Carers,

It certainly has been lovely to see the sunshine this week and see children in their summer dresses and shorts. I have been busy learning all about pool maintenance and all of the procedures ready for the pool to be open after the holidays. We certainly have exciting times ahead!

## Our school field



The field will hopefully have dried out by the end of the week so that children will be able to use it from Monday. Some of you may be aware that over the February half term, our field was damaged when a tractor (who was cutting the grass) got stuck. We have now had a large area of the field reseeded and we can finally see grass appearing. Unfortunately the children will not be able to use the play equipment or the sandpit as

these have appeared on our Health and Safety audit as areas to improve. The playground is going to be resurfaced with new edging over May Half Term and the sandpit will be moved to an area on the playground in the coming months.

## Ticks

With the warm weather approaching, the likelihood of children coming into contact with ticks becomes more likely. Ticks are small, and can vary in size from being as small as a tiny freckle, to the size of a baked bean. Ticks can be found across the UK, and survive in many different habitats, and we do occasionally find them in the school grounds. Ticks cannot fly, swim or jump. Current medical advice is that it is best practice for the school to remove a tick if we find one on your child - we will try and contact you to let you know if we are going to do this, and to discuss with you any further details, but if we cannot contact you we will remove the tick. To avoid ticks, the recommendations are that children wear long sleeves/trousers, which is not always practical in the summer, but we always ask children to wear these if they will be visiting the woods. There are also insect repellents that can deter ticks. If you require any further information, we have attached a leaflet to this email, or you

### Change of entrance for Year 2, 3, 4 Trial

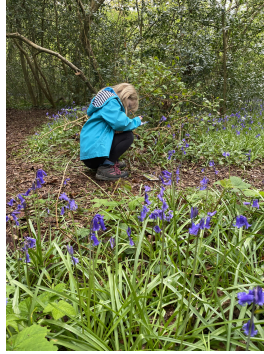
